

Ali Ağca is one of the most notorious criminals of the past century since he shot the Pope in St. Peter's Square on May 13, 1981.

No documentary has ever explored the life and charismatic personality of Ali Agca.. In our film it will be Ali himself who will narrate, for the first time; his life, his thoughts and we will try to trace his strong and complex personality.

Together with Ağca we will retrace all the significant stages of his life. We will travel with him to 7 countries: Turkey, Iran, Bulgaria, Poland, Austria, Portugal and finally Italy, where his actions ended dramatically in blood.

Who was Ali Ağca before he made an attempt on the Saint's life? Ali Ağca is not only the Pope's gunman, but a man with an incredible past. His childhood lived in absolute poverty, his anger at power, his indoctrination to the Gray Wolves' cause; the ultranationalist Turkish paramilitary training that led Ali into a war he now calls "Nazi-Islamic." Ali will tell us about throwing dynamite at Turkish Communist Party headquarters when he was 19 years old, and about the daring robbery of the Turkish National Bank in which he was involved. We will find out why he was nicknamed the "Emperor" in his 20s. We will discuss his responsibility in the murder of Abdi İpekçi, the editor of Milliyet, Turkey's leading daily newspaper and then his arrest and the escape from prison, his stay in Iran, and the fatal meeting with Ayatollah Khomeini.

How did he prepare the attack? What did he do the day before?





We will learn about the details of his capture, his countless lies and his disinformation about the investigation, the Pope's forgiveness, and we will finally know what they said to each other in those 22 minutes spent together with John Paul II.

Experts, journalists, vaticanists, historians, magistrates who investigated the case, former SISMI, KGB and CIA agents will be interviewed to bring a confrontation to facts given currently by Ali.
